
#### **Welcoming Our Newest Board Members**

#### Celebrating our 2023-2024 Georgia Pre-K Teachers of the Year









The Foundation is proud to announce the 2023–2024 Georgia Pre-K Teachers of the Year, Charlotte Richards and Merodie Brown!

Charlotte Richards is from Cussetta, Georgia. She graduated from Walden University with a bachelor's degree in early childhood development and obtained her master's degree in early childhood language and literacy. Charlotte has been a Georgia Pre-K teacher at Chattahoochee County Pre-K for 15 years. She and her husband have two children.

Merodie Brown is from Gwinnett, Georgia. Merodie is a University of Georgia graduate with a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's degree in early childhood education. She has been a Georgia Pre-K teacher at New Odyssey for Children in Hoschton, Georgia for five years. Merodie and her husband have four children.

Since 2016, the Georgia Foundation for Early Care and Learning has recognized two Georgia Pre-K Teachers of the Year every year – one from a public school setting, and another from a private school setting. This is no popularity contest: our winners are selected through a rigorous process that includes interviews and classroom observations conducted by a trained team of evaluators. As a result, these teachers have shared expertise and best practices with us through various platforms.

The Foundation awards each teacher a check for their personal use and each school a check for a classroom makeover and travel stipends.

We look forward to continuing to recognize these talented and dedicated professionals.

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# Celebrating our 2023-2024 Georgia's Early Childhood Educators of the Year



In 2021, the Foundation expanded the Georgia Pre-K Teacher of the Year program to recognize and celebrate Early Childhood Educators of the Year in three categories. Since that time, we have been able to recognize talented teachers from Child Care Learning Centers and Family Child Care Learning Homes. This year's winners are Noel Weimer, Bianca Brown, and Chantelle Hester!

The winner in the Infant Category winner is Noel Weimer. Noel is the teacher and owner of Water Oak Family Child Care Learning Home in Roswell, Georgia. She opened the facility in 2009 because a "good enough" child care center wasn't what she wanted for her children. In her care, children ages birth to 18 months experience The Creative Curriculum and experience outdoor adventures such as nature discovery, photography, and land sports. Noel describes her center as a place "where children truly feel at home."

The winner in the Toddler Category is Bianca Brown. Bianca is a teacher at the Greenbrier-Bradley School in Evans, Georgia. She teaches toddlers ages 15 to 36 months. She loves going to work every day and says "If I can change one mind, I did my job, and I can make a difference."

The winner in the Preschool Category winner is Chantelle Hester. Chantelle owns and directs Smart Starters Academy Family Child Care Learning Home in Savannah, Georgia. She opened Smart Starters Academy in 2014 and cherishes that her students and parents refer to her program as a "school, and not a daycare." Chantelle is a proud educator.

Winners were selected from six semi-finalists who each received a classroom observation and a personal interview by a panel of early childhood experts. Each winner will receive \$3,000 for their personal use, \$2,000 for a classroom makeover, and up to \$2,500 for their school to cover travel costs and stipends for substitute teachers as they fulfill their duties as Georgia's Early Childhood Educators of the Year.

### Happy Helpings: Feed Kids Free Healthy Meals this Summer

### Feed kids free healthy meals this summer





Summer is quickly approaching, and for many kids across Georgia, summer break means fun & and free time. But for some students, the summer can mean limited access to affordable, nutritious foods. Providing summer meals to children facing food insecurity is a year-round effort, and the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) needs your help.

Happy Helpings, Georgia's Summer Food Service Program, is a federally-funded, state-administered program that reimburses program operators who serve free healthy meals and snacks to children and teens in low-income areas when school is not in session. In the summer of 2022, 85 Georgia counties were served by Happy Helpings. Last summer, the program served more than 2.8 million meals in 100 counties.

If you operate a nonprofit organization, you may be eligible to participate in Happy Helpings to feed children free, healthy meals and get reimbursed for your efforts.
